2. **Community Grants** - for applications from \$501-\$5,000 aimed at supporting community groups with small capital projects, events, projects etc.


Community Groups within the Shire are now invited to apply for Council assistance under either category for the 2016/2017 financial year. Requests for operational funding, works-in-kind or reimbursement for expenses prior to the 2016/17 financial year will no longer be accepted under the guidelines. Furthermore, this is now the only pathway to request Council contribution for partnership funding for any project throughout the year. Please then consider all events, projects or infrastructure your community group is planning for the 2016/17 year carefully, as applications will only be open once per year.

If your community group is interested in applying for assistance under either of the grant categories, please make contact with our Manager of Community Services, at [cdo@gnowangerup.wa.gov.au](mailto:cdo@gnowangerup.wa.gov.au)) to discuss your idea. Our Community Development Officer will be available to assist with completing the application form and to answer any enquires you may have relating to the new format.

Applications are to be received no later than **4pm on Friday 6th May, 2016**. Please follow the guidelines in the application packs on how to submit your documentation. Applicants will be informed in writing of the outcome of their application, at the completion of the budget process.

We have seen an increase in the number of Parvovirus cases recently in the Ongerup area and we would like to remind all our clients to ensure that their pets vaccinations are up to date.

Parvovirus is a highly contagious and often fatal infection. It is passed between dogs through contact of all body fluids i.e. wee poop etc. But can also be carried on clothing, footwear toys etc.

Parvo can cause vomiting, diarrhoea, lethargy, dehydration and death. Vaccinations will reduce the risk and severity of the disease. All dogs are at risk, even those living in remote areas or farms.

If you are unsure of your pets vaccination status, please give us a call to discuss it and we will be able to check our records or advise you based on information you give us. The great news is that most dogs will be able to be protected against Parvovirus with a single injection and most puppies with two injections. Your pet's wellbeing is in your hands, but we are keen to help and want to assist you to do the best thing for you and your pets.
