ONGERUP LIBRARY 2017.

I finished my time in the Ongerup Library on Thursday 20th July. Tim Foster sent me a photo of the opening of the Ongerup Library on the 20th of July 1968. Which I thought was a fitting coincidence.

This prompted me to do some research. When I first came to Ongerup 1972 Jan Manning was doing the Library and it was open Tuesdays and Thursdays and Tuesday nights as we played badminton then.

After Jan was Kaye Murnane and then Robyn House. Then in the mid-eighties Mrs. Ann Hart took over.

Mrs. Hart was Keen on Bowls and Golf, open days and Ladies days tended to be on Thursdays so I checked my diaries and the first time I relieved was in 1986. This was highly irregular as Mrs. Hart paid me cash. I think the amount depended on how well she went at the sport she happened to be playing at the time as it always varied. The library was open from 10 am -2 pm on Thursdays and then we played ladies tennis in summer. I relieved all through the 80's and into the 90's just on and off although in the 90's more often as I went in and did the exchanges as this was a huge task.

Then in 1997 Mrs. Hart went to England and I had 5 months straight so we thought maybe I should go on the Shire books. Then Mrs. Hart retired on the 5th August 1999 and we had an afternoon tea in the hall after Library and over 40 people attended. I started full time on the 10th August 1999. That was when we got computers in the Library.

Then on the 26th of July 2017, the shire invited me to a farewell lunch with staff and Councilors

This was lovely afternoon, the lunch was delicious and the president, Keith House, said nice things about me and presented me with a gift voucher to Chimes Spa Resort in Denmark. I thank the Shire for such a lovely treat. I thank the girls in the front office for their gift as well Thank you all so much.

I really loved my time in the Library and I urge Ongerup to visit the Library while Oliva Letter is there

From 10 am, to 4 pm on Wednesdays. Ongerup really needs to patronize the Library or I fear for its future.

Thank you Ongerup for all your support over the years I really will miss my Tuesdays and Thursdays
