

## BOOK CLUB REVIEW JUNE 2016.

### **The Hundred-Year-Old Man Who Climbed Out of the Window and Disappeared**

by Jonas Jonasson. It all starts on the one-hundredth birthday of Allan Karlsson. Sitting quietly in his room in an old people's home,

he is waiting for the party he-never-wanted-anyway to begin. The Mayor is going to be there. The press is going to be there. But, as it turns out, Allan is not... Slowly but surely Allan climbs out of his bedroom window, into the flowerbed (in his slippers) and makes his getaway. And so begins his picaresque and unlikely journey involving criminals, several murders, a suitcase full of cash, and incompetent police. As his escapades unfold, we learn something of Allan's earlier life in which – remarkably – he helped to make the atom bomb, became friends with American presidents, Russian tyrants, and Chinese leaders, and was a participant behind the scenes in many key events of the twentieth century. Already a huge bestseller across Europe, *The Hundred-Year-Old Man Who Climbed Out of the Window and Disappeared* is a fun and feel-good book for all ages. This book was Judy Major's choice, so on Monday night 5 of us braved the slippery roads and headed for her place. For the first time we didn't get lost getting to the house. We spent the first half hour catching up and then got into the serious business of discussing the book. # Gnowangerup News

## SHIRE PRESIDENTS REPORT

Council business for May was very varied. Council was able to support expressions of intent for business expansion with two agenda items; these items are always very encouraging in terms of community benefit. The proposed sale of land resulting from the successful planning department endorsement of lot 556 Structure Plan continues the development of the old water corp site into a valued business location.

In terms of community assets, two items were raised at very different ends of the spectrum. The pool project reached the exciting contractual milestone of practical completion on Friday 13 May 2016 and the landscaping of the pool surrounds will commence in mid June.

Obsolete television transmission towers were approved for disposal and may create an opportunity for someone to reshape & utilise old assets. The other significant item was the endorsement of the 2016/17 firebreak order; this will be included with rate notices in the usual manner. Congratulations and thank you to all brigade members on their appointments in the necessary roles for the year.

The Shire also conducted a business forum in May, guest speakers included representatives from Western Power, LandCorp, the Great Southern Development Commission and Water Corp. It was pleasing to have a great range of businesses attend from across the shire, and we hope all were able to take something away from the morning. I believe the organisations that presented appreciated the feed back received. Amongst many issues raised, two points of interest were regarding the future of remote power provision, and waste water treatment management.

Works are currently being undertaken to repair the road network damaged by the storm on the 20th January. Due to the extend of the damage it is likely that these works will take between 12—18 months to complete. Although it is an inconvenience to rate payers the shire will benefit from having a renewed asset largely funded through grants and which will not require renewal for some time.

## In other news;

### **STANDPIPE FEE AND CHARGE**

The adopted 2015/16 Annual Budget identified that an electronic swipe card system was to be installed at the Gnowangerup Standpipe for all hours access.

The Shire of Gnowangerup has implemented the system and imposed a fee of \$22.00 (GST inclusive) for the supply of an individual card.




