Members are reminded that subs are now due, \$75 for full membership and \$25 for social.




MAY'S BOOK CLUB REVIEW



Census recruiting in your community!

Up to 2,300 Census Field Officers needed across Western Australia

Make a difference in your community and join Australia's largest logistical peacetime operation—the 2016 Census of Population and Housing.

This year's Census is on August 9, and the Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) is looking for dedicated, enthusiastic self-starters to fill more than 2,300 Field Officer positions across Western Australia. If you're tech-savvy, know your community well and are eager to make a difference, the ABS wants to hear from you.

Working on the Census is a great way to contribute to your community. The data you help collect provides an important statistical snapshot of Australia. It supports planning, policy and funding decisions for a range of local services and infrastructure—from housing and transport to health and education.

A few things have changed since the last Census. In 2016, most households will receive a letter giving them a unique login number and instructions on how to complete the Census online. Approximately 65 per cent of households are expected to complete the Census online however paper forms will still be available for households who need them.

Field Officers play a critical role by visiting households, encouraging online participation and ensuring everyone makes the count. And as a Field Officer, you'll earn around \$21 per hour, receive motor vehicle allowances and enjoy flexible working hours. You will also be responsible for daily administrative tasks and the security of Census materials.

You'll need to be a good communicator, reasonably fit, licensed to drive and willing to travel and work independently. Field Officers will also need to have access to home computer and internet.

The positions are part-time and most of the work will be conducted during August and September. People from diverse backgrounds are encouraged to apply.

- Turn Yield Data into a quick reference map
- Colour code your farm into Yield Performance,

Preparation for the course will ensure maximum learning and practical application.

To prepare for the course:

Laptop computer :

- We will be working with SMS software as it reads and writes to 95% of machinery on the market.
- If you have been using PLM or AFS software this is a simple change over process:

- First time users for SMS/PLM/AFS - You can download a free 21 day trial of the software at: <http://dealer.agleader.com/kbp/index.php?View=entry&EntryID=409> (note you have 21 days of full function to decide if you wish to proceed to purchase)
Don't download until just prior to the course date, otherwise the trial will expire!!!
- JD /Apex users - Bring the laptop with this software - it is still usable, (slightly more complicated)
- Download and install Dropbox to your laptop and know your Dropbox account details.
- Install Google Earth Pro on your laptop. It will ask you for a username and password, username is your email and password: GEPFREE

iPad/Tablet/smart phone:

- Know your iTunes Account password - and have access to funds should you wish to purchase apps.
- Download and install Drop box from the App store - connect it to your account.
- Download the Free Apps of Google Earth and Measure Map from the apps store.

If you have an Android tablet, bring it, however the mapping apps in this platform as around 12 months behind apple.

Bring Data cards from Harvesters and/or other machinery.



I have been conducting Fuel Gauge trials in the area for a while. In 2015 I conducted a calibration trial in barley at Gnowangerup. The NDVI readings put through the NCALC program predicted the in-season response to nitrogen very well and was great for fine tuning the results we got from the soil test.

We used the recommended N rate (30N) beside a half rate (21N) and a 1.5x rate (39N).
