Bring it along!

- Turn Yield Data into a quick reference map
- Colour code your farm into Yield Performance,
- Learn how to transfer maps onto your iPad,
- Make prescription and mud maps,
- Record soil sample sites, &
- Measure fence line distances with iPhone or iPad.



You will need to bring a laptop computer and iPad  
(including power cords and mouse)

Preparation for the course will ensure maximum learning and practical application.

### To prepare for the course:

#### **Laptop computer :**

- We will be working with SMS software as it reads and writes to 95% of machinery on the market.
- If you have been using PLM or AFS software this is a simple change over process:  
Call Julien Coles on 0428 120 917 for guidance on this topic
- First time users for SMS/PLM/AFS - You can download a free 21 day trial of the software at:  
<http://dealer.agleader.com/kbp/index.php?View=entry&EntryID=409>  
(note you have 21 days of full function to decide if you wish to proceed to purchase)  
Don't download until just prior to the course date, otherwise the trial will expire!!!
- JD /Apex users – Bring the laptop with this software – it is still usable, (slightly more complicated)
- Download and install **Dropbox** to your laptop – and **know your Dropbox account** details.
- Install **Google Earth Pro** on your laptop. It will ask you for a username and password, username is your email and password: GEPFREE

#### **iPad/Tablet/smart phone:**

- Know your iTunes Account password – and have access to funds should you wish to purchase apps.
- Download and install **Drop box** from the App store – connect it to your account.
- Download the Free Apps of **Google Earth** and **Measure Map** from the apps store.

If you have an Android tablet, bring it, however the mapping apps in this platform are around 12 months behind apple.

Bring Data cards from Harvesters and/or other machinery.

# Gnowangerup News

Council business for the month of April included 3 financial commercial items. Council has received and approve tenders for the storm damaged road infrastructure and drainage reinstatement, the successful tenders were:

- RFQ1 (Roads Tender) was awarded to Gaia Civil
- RFQ 2 (Drainage Tender) was awarded to Mining Drilling Services

The Shire has resolved to negotiate with Landcorp for a parcel of land on the new development on Quinn Street. The site provides group dwelling opportunities which will match shire accommodation requirements and will lead to a review of all shire housing stock.

The last confidential item was the lease of Virginia land. One Expression of Interest was received and the lease was awarded to the Gnowangerup Sporting Complex as it met the commercial financial requirement set by Council.

The Road Forum held in Borden was well attended and it was a great opportunity for Council to present current funding scenarios, the road hierarchy and associated levels of service and cost implications. Feedback on operational issues was presented which was a useful follow up to the customer satisfaction survey conducted earlier in the year. A summary of the meeting has been compiled to go on the shire web site and individual responses to community members have been sent out.

Our community has had an extremely challenging few weeks in experiencing a couple of fatal tragedies that saw all the community pulling together to provide support and comfort to those effected. A big thank you to all supporting agencies both professional and our volunteers our thoughts are with you during this difficult time. Our community has shown its strength and resilience and Council would like to send its condolences and sympathy to all the families and friends affected by the tragedies.

## In other news;

### ***My Council Website***

On 29 April 2016, the Hon. Tony Simpson MLA, Minister for Local Government; Community Services, Seniors and Volunteering; Youth, launched the State Government's *MyCouncil* website: [www.mycouncil.wa.gov.au](http://www.mycouncil.wa.gov.au)

The website presents the last four years of audited data provided by local governments in their Annual Reports and Compliance Audit Returns. This information was already publicly available and has long been open for scrutiny on local government websites.

It is important, however, that the information provided on the *MyCouncil* website is seen in its proper context, especially around interpreting simplified measures such as percentage rate increases, and financial health indicator (FHI) scores.

These measures are only indicative of the overall performance of a local government. Because one local government receives a higher or lower FHI rating on the *MyCouncil* website, does not necessarily mean that it is performing better or worse financially than another local government. Inviting direct comparisons based on simplified measures can often be misleading.

To properly understand the financial picture of a local government a member of the public needs to look at the broader picture and consider the many complex factors that contribute to it, including the range and level of services provided to the community, the efficiency of service delivery, and community satisfaction with their local government.

Local government officers are constantly working to improve their local government's performance and to produce positive outcomes for their communities.

As you probably already know, the Year 3-6 students went to Canberra on school camp. One place stood out to me, The Australian War Memorial...

Sgt James Forrest enlisted in the 460<sup>th</sup> Squadron, RAAF in 1940. He

flew to London to complete his training. He joined a crew of 4 Australian and 2 British pilots flying a Lancaster bomber. Out of all of his successful missions, one wasn't so lucky...



He left the RAAF base at 2044 hours on the 9<sup>th</sup> August 1943. His aircraft was shot down over Berlin that night. After the war, the search crews tried to find the wreck, but no trace of the bomber was ever seen again.

He was my great, great uncle.

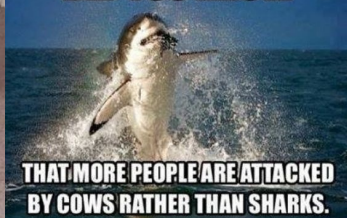

## Census recruiting in your community!

### Up to 2,300 Census Field Officers needed across Western Australia

Make a difference in your community and join Australia's largest logistical peacetime operation—the 2016 Census of Population and Housing.

This year's Census is on August 9, and the Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) is looking for dedicated, enthusiastic self-starters to fill more than 2,300 Field Officer positions across Western Australia. If you're tech-savvy, know your community well and are eager to make a difference, the ABS wants to hear from you.

Working on the Census is a great way to contribute to your community. The data you help collect provides an important statistical snapshot of Australia. It supports planning, policy and funding decisions for a range of local services and infrastructure—from housing and transport to health and education.

A few things have changed since the last Census. In 2016, most households will receive a letter giving them a unique login number and instructions on how to complete the Census online. Approximately 65 per cent of households are expected to complete the Census online however paper forms will still be available for households who need them.

Field Officers play a critical role by visiting households, encouraging online participation and ensuring everyone makes the count. And as a Field Officer, you'll earn around \$21 per hour, receive motor vehicle allowances and enjoy flexible working hours. You will also be responsible for daily administrative tasks and the security of Census materials.

You'll need to be a good communicator, reasonably fit, licensed to drive and willing to travel and work independently. Field Officers will also need to have access to home computer and internet.

The positions are part-time and most of the work will be conducted during August and September. People from diverse backgrounds are encouraged to apply.
