Centre Manager

Part Time: 9 hours per week (1.5 days)

The Jerramungup Community Resource Centre requires an enthusiastic and self-motivated person to take on the role of Centre Manager. The position begins with a 3 month probationary period.

As Centre Manager, you will be responsible for:

Overseeing all operations of the Jerramungup Community Resource Centre including the library services

Supervising staff, including trainees

Compiling reports, e.g. yearly Business Plan, tender application, grant applications and acquittals

Working closely with the Management Committee and attending committee meetings

Liaising with the Department of Regional Development, Shire and other stakeholders

This role requires a high level of communication, organisation, initiative, time management and reliability. A good knowledge of grant applications & acquittals, budgeting and business planning will be beneficial, however training can be provided in this area. On the job training will be provided in all other areas of the position.

This is a unique opportunity to take part in a role that is continually evolving and gives the successful applicant the chance to play a part in the CRC Network and the community. This position will report to the Management Committee of the Jerramungup CRC.

Finance Officer (Bookkeeper)

Part time: 7 hours per week

The Jerramungup Community Resource Centre requires a bookkeeper to assist the Management Committee to develop and maintain best practices in its financial management. This is a part time position, 7 hours per week. The position begins with a 3 month probationary period.

The bookkeeper is responsible for the following, in addition to other duties deemed suitable by the Centre Manager or Management Committee as they arise;

- Compiling financial reports as requested by the Jerramungup CRC Management Committee and the Community Resource Network
- Assisting with funding acquittals and reports
- Wages, Superannuation and BAS
- Invoicing, creditor payments and banking

This role requires a high level of communication, organisation, initiative, and time management skills. Competency with MYOB is an asset. There will be on site training in the CRC financial systems and requirements.




