Ongerup Wintery Weather

Ongerup has been colder and wetter than average this year. So far, the Ongerup weather station has recorded 393mms of rain up until 31 August. Our annual average is 384 mms, so we exceeded our annual average in just 8 months. The winter rain is as follows: June 49.2mms, July 24.8mms and August 74.2mms. It was the wettest August since 1998. Average temperatures for the winter months were approximately 1 degree colder than average, which just confirms what we all thought.

The average maxima and minima are as follows

June average minimum was 6.2 (long term average is 06.8) Average maximum was 14.8 (long term average is 15.9)

July average minimum was 4.5 (long term average is 05.8) Average maximum was 14.7 (long term average is 14.9)

August average minimum was 4.2 (long term average is 5.8) Average maximum was 14.5 (long term average is 15.6)

And we could get more cold nights. Our mulberry tree never flowers until after the last frost, and it doesn't look like flowering yet. We don't know how it knows, but it has never been wrong.

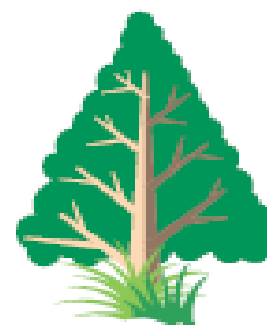
