## Lotterywest Support the Gnowangerup Pool Redevelopment Project

Despite it being a wet and windy day, on Monday 13th June Hon. Tuck Waldron MLA and Peter Rundle braved the weather to present a cheque to the Shire of Gnowangerup from Lotterywest for \$180,945 toward the new Gnowangerup Community

Swimming Pool Redevelopment project. The additional funds will provide a variety of extra features to the new facility including beautifully landscaped gardens, lawn and play area, shade shelters and improvements to the grounds.

“The Gnowangerup Swimming Pool redevelopment project has been an important project for the local community”, Mr Waldron said.

“Not only will it allow the continued provision of aquatic activities for the region into the future; its new location also creates a sporting hub for residents where both winter and summer sports can be enjoyed.”

“The additional funds that have been received will allow for a more inviting space for users.”

Community members may have noticed contractors McCorkell Constructions have now left site after obtaining practical completion in May. Staff at McCorkell Constructions have provided a fantastic facility, despite battling the trying weather of January and juggling some last minute decisions made by the Swimming Pool Committee. Committee President Travis Hawkins briefly spoke about the concourse and some of the issues faced.

“Whilst it’s unfortunate we were unable receive the stencilled finish we were after for the concourse, a run of bad luck with commissioning available sub-contractors meant we were left with no option other than the pewter coloured finish we now have”.

“Regardless, as a committee we are very happy with the final product and look forward to seeing all aspects of the project come together”.

With funds now secured, the landscaping component of the project is underway. Local landscaping contractor BGL Solutions was awarded the contract, and staff have been busy levelling the site, laying reticulation and filling planter boxes since the beginning of June. It is expected that planting will be finished by the end of June and turf will be laid with the community’s help in the first few weeks of July.
