Welcome to Dr Gemma Yardley



It has been an eventful few weeks for me, moving to Gairdner and commencing general practice in the Shire of Jerramungup. I thought as the new face you will see when you come to get repeat prescriptions, blood tests, or check ups it may be nice to know a little about my background and how I came to be working as a GP in Jerramungup and Bremer Bay.

I grew up in Perth and went to Churchlands High School before studying medicine at the University of Western Australia. I completed my 5th year of university in Kalgoorlie as a student at the rural clinical school and have always enjoyed my rural rotations. I then completed an internship and residency at Royal Perth Hospital after graduating from university.

My grandparents are from Albany and Katanning so through out my childhood we spent many holidays in the Great Southern region and when there was an opportunity to take a position at Albany Hospital I left at the chance. During my time in Albany I completed a Diploma in Child Health, worked in the Albany

Health Campus emergency department, and then went on to complete my general practice fellowship and training at Hillside Family Practice.

It was also during this time that I met my partner and first started spending time in Gairdner and the Bremer Bay region. When the job became available in Jerramungup and Bremer Bay this was an ideal opportunity for me to attempt the combine a farm lifestyle with the work that I love.

In terms of the practice I am looking forward to offering the services that Dr Roemer did with the addition of women's health and shared antenatal care. I take pride in being a thorough and caring doctor and I would like for the community to get to know me over time and to feel that I have these qualities as well as being kind, approachable, and having a good knowledge of medicine.

We have changed the opening hours of the medical centres slightly to 8am til 4pm to try to accommodate my commitments outside of work, however I will endeavour to offer after hours appointments on a regular basis so that as many community members as possible have access to health care.

Due to my circumstances, including living out of town, I am unable to partake in the formal on call roster for the health centres, however we have some very experienced remote care nurses working in the Shire at the moment and some wonderful and dedicated St John Ambulance staff and volunteers who are available if needed for emergencies.

I would like to take this opportunity to clarify that we have been bulk billing at the practices over the past few weeks due to internet and technological issues and to allow a transition stage but we will be phasing in mixed billing over the coming weeks. This will not affect pensioners, health care card holders or children and for others I have tried to minimise the gap payments.

The practice operates as an independent small business and I employ my own staff. While I understand that the billing policy is a change for the community, it is necessary to ensure the financial viability of the business.

I am looking forward to getting to know and be part of this community and hopefully will be able to provide a comprehensive service to the Shire over the coming years.

It has been a fairly hectic few weeks at work, but once time allows I want to be able to get more involved by running some community events such as mental health awareness and women's health information sessions.

So far you have all been incredibly welcoming and supportive and made my first few weeks in Jerramungup and Bremer Bay very enjoyable - thank you.

Community Financial Assistant Grants 2018/19

Community Groups within the Shire of Gnowangerup are now invited to apply for the Community Financial Assistance Grants (CFAG) Program. There are three categories of funding available for projects taking place in 18/19 financial year.

1. **Quick Grants** - for applications up to \$500.00, primarily for volunteer support.
2. **Community Grants**- for applications from \$501.00 - \$5,000.00 aimed at supporting community groups with small capital projects, events, projects etc.
3. **Special Requests Community Grants** - for applications from \$5000.00 - \$20,000.00 aimed at supporting community groups with large capital projects, events, projects etc. The purpose of the grant is not to fund operating costs

Comprehensive guidelines, application forms and acquittal statements for each category can be found on our website under "Public Notices" or by contacting the Shire Office on 9827 1007.

Requests for operational funding, works-in-kind or reimbursement for expenses prior to the 2018/2019 financial year will no longer be accepted under the guidelines. Furthermore, this is now the only pathway to request Council contribution for partnership funding for any project throughout the year. Please consider all events, projects or infrastructure your community group is planning for the 2018/19 year carefully, as applications will only be open once per year.

If your community group is interested in applying for assistance under any of the grant categories, please make contact with the Shire of Gnowangerup at cdo@gnowangerup.wa.gov.au or 98271007 to discuss your idea.

Step 1 - Contact the Shire of Gnowangerup to discuss your project idea on 9827 1007

Step 2 - Complete the respective Grant Application Form.

Step 3 - Submit the application form by 4:00pm 11/5/2018.

Step 4 - Applications are assessed; Council approves suitable applicants at the Annual Budget meeting.

Step 5 - Applicants are notified in writing in August 2018.

The Shire of Gnowangerup will be holding a Grant Writing Workshop later in the year and will advise shortly of the dates. We strongly recommend Community Groups to attend this workshop to assist with grant application submission.

We look forward to supporting our fantastic community organisations in 2018/2019.
