The Protective Behaviours program was developed in the 1970's and is now a mandatory part of the Australian and Western Australian curriculum.

- It aims to enhance problem-solving and communication skills of children.
- It encourages children to identify situations that are unsafe or potentially unsafe, and to develop practical strategies to counter these situations in order to preserve their physical and emotional safety.
- It focuses on addressing a wide range of personal safety issues perpetrated by known or unknown people, including being lost, bullying, abduction and all forms of abuse.

The Protective Behaviours program is based on two simple themes:

- 1. We all have the right to feel safe all the time.**
- 2. Nothing is so awful that we can't talk with someone about it.**

In this course for parents, we will look at strategies and resources that parents can be utilising at home to help build these very important skills into the lives of their children.
