This year we also commence our new strategic planning three year cycle which has involved identifying school priorities and further fine tuning curriculum, numeracy and literacy development.

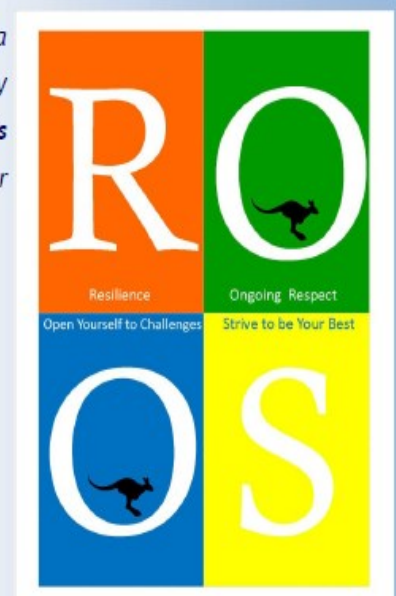
