WEDGE TAILED EAGLE TALK AT YONGERGNOW

WITH SIMON CHERRIMAN

Yongergnow was privileged to have Simon Cherriman visit the centre and give a presentation on his research into the preservation of this amazing bird. Simon's enthusiasm and passion for the environment and birds in particular was a delight. His presentation in the morning had adults and children enthralled as he presented some amazing facts from his research. Satellite tracking has revealed that these birds can fly up to 300 - 400 km a day. They can fly up to 6300 km high and as far away from their nest as 1800 km. After the talk the group moved over to the Ongerup school where we watched Simon climb a tree and install a small nest box that he had donated. The children will be able to monitor their box and hopefully some lucky birds will have a new home to nest in. Simon has been working closely with Fred Duncan monitoring nests on his property and we thank Fred very much for organising this day.

ABOUT AUSCHEM ACCREDITATION



Reaccreditation- 1 Day Course:

Participants must have completed Risk Management in Pesticide Use (or an equivalent qualification).

Chemical users who have let their accreditation lapse for over 10 years are not eligible to attend re-accreditation programmes and will need to re-take Risk Management in Pesticide Use

AusChem Accreditation: Risk Management in Pesticide Use- 2 Day Course

Participants will learn on a practical level how to improve their integrated pest management programmes, to better choose the right chemical for the job and to apply it more accurately. The course is designed for people who will be spraying chemicals without supervision. This is an accredited course and successful completion will lead to issuance of AusChem WA accreditation.

WHAT IS RECYCLING

Shire staff are often asked what should be placed in recycling bins and also what happens to the material in the bins when they are emptied.

Warren Blackwood Waste was the successful tenderer when the waste collection contract recently came up for renewal. Mat Webb from WBW has this to say about recycling:

"We have had a lot of enquiries recently from most of the shires we service, in regards to recycling material and where it ends up.

Aluminium and steel cans as well as paper and cardboard are easily processed and we are able to get those processed quite easily, through Remondis in Perth.

Glass has been an issue for a long time and there hasn't been a receiver for a number of years now. WBW uses it as cleanfill at our Kojonup landfill site so we encourage everyone to put it in the recycling bin.

In general, we encourage people to put the following items in the recycling bin:

- paper/cardboard/magazines, etc
- all plastics
- aluminium (alfoil wrapping)
- steel cans
- glass

The cleaner the material the better, but as long as there isn't still food or anything in the containers, it isn't a problem.

Grease, oil, etc on paper or cardboard is fine.

We sort all materials by hand at our facility in Kojonup, and encourage any Shire or interested residents to come for a look at any stage. The reason we accept materials other companies will not is because we have the ability to stockpile and are optimistic about recycling into the future.
