Bendigo Bank Update

The Shire has completed its due diligence regarding the possibility of establishing a Bendigo Bank Agency and has come to the conclusion that it is not feasible for the Council to take on this role for the following reasons:

1. It is not core local government business and these projects are normally more successful when championed by the community.
2. The Bank requires agency staff to actively cross-sell all its products and services. The more sold, the more income generated so there could possibly be significant targets to achieve a profit before the community is to receive any benefit. None of our existing staff wish to take on this role.
3. A lot of staff training is required. Four units must be completed at Deakin University with a mandatory pass rate of 100% in each unit. A weeks training in Tambellup would be required which would leave our front office short staffed. Other ongoing training, also to be completed at the Tambellup Branch, would be required especially now that Royal Commission into banking reforms are being rolled out.
4. To manage the agency without impacting negatively on existing workloads, an additional staff member would need to be funded at an approximate cost of \$100,000 per annum including on costs.
5. We would not be able to recoup our \$35,000 set up costs and new staff member costs to run the agency unless the bank was profitable. A large number of business accounts would need to be transferred to the agency for it to be successful and the Shire is unable to guarantee sufficient accounts to safeguard ratepayer costs.

Should a community group wish to drive the establishment of an agency, the Shire could assist in terms of location and a contribution towards set up costs. This would be a more satisfactory option than Council providing a banking service.

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ONGERUP SEPTEMBER BOOK CLUB REVIEW

“The Coves” by Peter Whish-Wilson

In 1849, former Australian convicts known as the Sydney Coves are trying to make their fortune in San Francisco. Young Samuel Bellamy endures a hazardous journey to the bay town in the hope of finding his mother. The 12 year-old is adopted by ruthless men who control the lawless town but with so many men gripped by gold fever he must constantly watch his back. Whish-Wilson has created a brutal portrayal of Australia, transportation and California in this crime novel based on historical facts. He crafts a sense of the filthy conditions in which each desperate character is struggling to survive and yearning for their lot in life to improve.

Book club was held at Sandy’s house with only 5 of our members. General opinion of the book was not high with an average score of about 4/10! There were too many characters and rather ‘dated’ way of writing which was in keeping with the era. Although it included some interesting history, that most of us were unaware of, some doubted its authenticity. It had an unsatisfying ending with no outcome of the boy’s mother’s true identity. Many didn’t read it at all and it was difficult to get into despite having a great review.
