



Tribute to my father Ian Duncan (1925 - 2019) by Fred Duncan

How to say .. "A great man that lived through such a century of change." I was stumped. Then I received a short condolence message from a family friend of 45 years. Just 6 words. "He was a wonderful human being." A man of few words, Dad would be happy with that. Such a strong sense of right and wrong, and honesty; he instantly gained the absolute trust of all with his confident abilities and knowledge.



A boy couldn't have been blessed with a better father. I didn't see a beach or learn to swim or tie a fish-hook, but I was immersed in his world of Agriculture, Aeronautics, Astronomy, Meteorology, Mathematics, History. 100 questions a day and never a complaint. 99 answered, and the tricky one was always explained the next day. My Grandmother lived on the farm, deteriorating into Dementia, and we visited frequently. On leaving, he would look down and say, "If I ever get old, boy, just shoot me." He had a dread of losing his abilities.

Whenever I see a Satellite, I remember being 7 years old and woken at 4 AM to go to the shearing shed to sit on the back ramp. He said, "Look to the East." Sure enough, a bright slow moving Satellite appeared and crossed the night sky. He said, "That's Apollo, doing its last orbit before taking Neil Armstrong to the moon." We were certainly taught young. My sisters could all drive the Fergie tractor by the time they left primary school. And as a young teenager I drove his Monaro. A few lines always remembered ~ "You need to learn to drive on the Highway, so you drive us to Perth boy. I'm in the car as guardian, so its legal."

In the 70s, he would sign me out of boarding school and take me to Claremont Speedway on Friday nights, and on Saturday to the football to see Barry Cable play, or the Barbagello Raceway to see the Holden team in Toranas and Monaros trying to catch Allan Moffatt's Mustang. And on Sundays at Jandakot airport we would do hours of Circuits and Bumps as he renewed his Pilot's license. Another of his lines I remember was, "I might have a heart attack so you'd better learn to fly this thing." I was only 14 but he would relax, give me his faith, fold his arms and trust that I had listened. And by God I always did.



I'm proud to say I did 30 harvests alongside him. I did start to think I knew better sometimes. But when he finally hung up his boots after putting our crop in at the age of 82, I realised he'd done 60 seasons. We all think we'll know more than our parents but now at our average age of 60 years, we his children know we never will. Maybe if the 5 of us combined our talents we could almost equal our father, since he handed us just a little piece each. He may be gone now, but we'll never forget anything he taught us. And I can honestly say he would have been very embarrassed by the crowd that turned up for his funeral! But we thank you very much.
