A Tribute to Kenneth Ernest Pech AM JP

Ken was born on 21 September 1939, the second of four children. He grew up on the family farm near Brookton, going to school in Brookton. He was then accepted at Narrogin Agricultural College, where he studied for two years.

He met his wife Judith at a Junior Farmers social, after she was appointed to Brookton as a primary school teacher. In the mid 1950s, his father purchased uncleared land 40 kms south of Gnowangerup. This was gradually developed and Ken and Judith moved to North Stirling Downs, where they brought up their 6 children. All six attended Gnowangerup District High School and Ken had a 20 year association with GDHS P & C Association.

Ken was an enthusiastic farmer, loved his sheep and his dogs, particularly Parker. His involvement with Local Government began in 1981 at an extra ordinary election for a councillor in the South Ward in the Gnowangerup Shire. There was an election, Ken door knocked the area and received 95% of the vote.

In 1984, he was elected as Deputy President, then he was elected as Gnowangerup Shire President in 1986. He continued in this position until 1994, when he stepped down from the President's role to continue in leadership roles at a state level. He was President of Country Shire Councils Association from 1992 to 1994 and State President of WA Municipal Association from 1994 to 1996. He was also a WA delegate to the Australian Local Government Association.

He was Deputy President of Gnowangerup again from 2003 to 2007 and Gnowangerup Shire President from 2007 to 2009. He was made a Freeman of Gnowangerup Shire in July 2006.

During his time in Local Government, he lobbied strongly for increased funding for local roads, better telecommunications, improvement to medical facilities in rural areas and more doctors in small country towns.

He retired from local government in October 2013 after 32 years service. He then focussed his attentions back to family, farming and his bees.

He was appointed a Justice of the Peace in 1986. He was awarded Australian honours on Australia Day 1999 for his outstanding service to Local Government. He was awarded the Centenary Medal on 1 January 2001.

His other community service included 6 years on the Board of the Great Southern Development Commission, a long term member and past president of Gnowangerup Rotary Club, member of the Gnowangerup Agricultural College Advisory Committee, Board member and chairman of Yongergnow Malleefowl Centre. In 2019, he was awarded the first Life Membership of Yongergnow. He was a member of the Order of Australia Association and was Great Southern chairman of the Association from 2015 to 2019. Ken and Judith retired to Albany in late 2018. Sadly his health deteriorated rapidly this year and he passed away peacefully on 9 October 2019.

His funeral in Gnowangerup on 21 October was attended by a large crowd who wished to honour his achievements and support his family; his wife Judith, his 6 children and 10 grandchildren.

Ken was passionate about his community. He will be remembered for his life of service and deserves to rest in peace.
