"Choices we make"

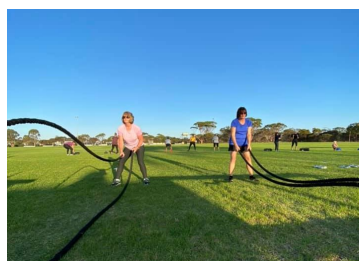


Get Active Ongerup!

Unfortunately we had no section winners in the fours, but did have a few good wins under some very windy conditions.

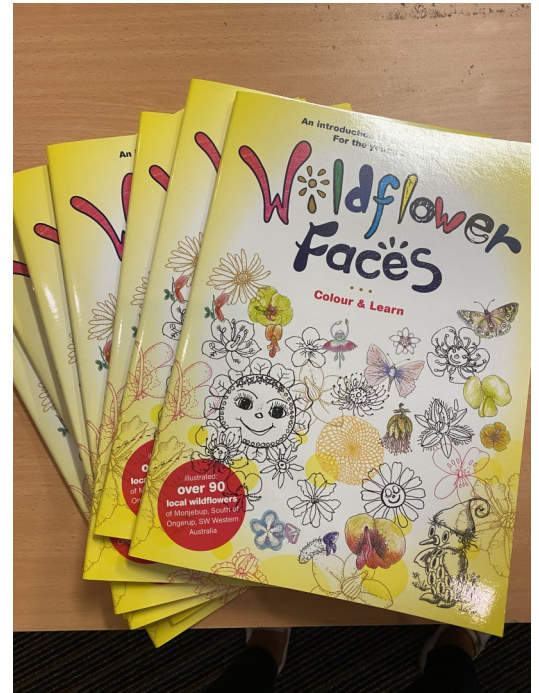

The total amount of money in a standard Monopoly game is \$15,140; real money was slipped into packs of play money that were smuggled into POW camps inside Germany during World War II.

A PIECE OF HISTORY ;- SETTLEMENT OF ONGERUP

George Moir lived at "Mongup" Borden and when his eldest son John got married to Jean Moir 1889 they lived at Mongup for a short time, before moving in 1891, to the land his father leased at "Warperup" some 5 miles (approx 8.5km) west of the now Ongerup townsite, being the first white settlers in the Ongerup area. They lived in a 3 roomed galvanised iron house with cement floor and detached kitchen built with she-ok slabs and raised 4 children. Nearest neighbours were 15 miles (24 Klm) away at Mongup, where they had to ride once a week to collect mail – mail came from Albany one week and Broomehill the next. Their only callers were occasional travellers to the gold and copper mines at Ravensthorpe who had lost their way! The nearest town was Broomehill – 60 odd miles away. Wool was carted to Albany once a year, the trip taking 3 days each way, and stores for 12 months brought back. These included;- 1 ton of flour, 1 ton of sugar, 2 or 3 chests of tea and several bags of salt. John was often away on hunting trips or shearing at Mongup, leaving Jean and children alone with no transport and only the indigenous people for company.

Jean had a busy life, she made clothes for the family on a hand sewing machine, milked cows, and made butter, bread and soap and together with John, cured mutton and pork. In 1910 others settlers started coming to Ongerup district, so for the first time they had neighbours.

A big thank you to Ongerup Playgroup for their huge donation of toys and craft resources! We have all enjoyed the new mat, it is perfect for gym activities such as roly pollys. It glitter has us all excited and we can't wait to shower in it during the Holi Festival!

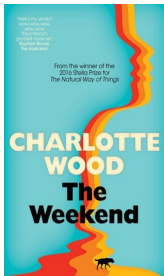

BOOK CLUB REVIEW FOR MARCH 2020. THE WEEKEND BY CHARLOTTE WOOD.



Four older women have a lifelong friendship of the best kind: loving, practical, frank and steadfast. But when Sylvie dies, the ground shifts dangerously for the remaining three. Can they survive together without her? They are Jude, a once-famous restaurateur, Wendy, an acclaimed public intellectual, and Adele, a renowned actress now mostly out of work. Struggling to recall exactly why they've remained close all these years, the grieving women gather for Christmas at Sylvie's old beach house - not for festivities, but to clean the place out before it is sold.

Without Sylvie to maintain the group's delicate equilibrium, frustrations build and painful memories press in. Fraying tempers, an elderly dog, unwelcome guests and too much wine collide in a storm that brings long-buried hurts to the surface - and threatens to sweep away their friendship for good.

The Weekend explores growing old and growing up, and what happens when we're forced to uncover the lies we tell ourselves. Sharply observed and excruciatingly funny, this is a jewel of a book: a celebration of tenderness and friendship that is nothing short of a masterpiece

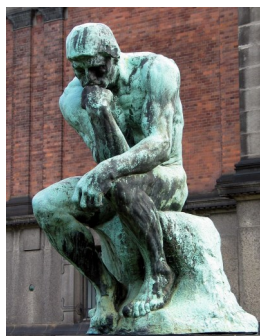
