A PIECE OF HISTORY – SETTLEMENT OF ONGERUP

ON THE ROAD TO ONGERUP;-

Impression of an interesting trip and an exceedingly promising district

Extract from;- BY A “SUNDAY TIMES SPECIAL”, AUGUST 3rd 1913

The opening of the rail line to Ongerup

Like every dog, every district has its day, and it happened to be Ongerup's day on Wednesday week, (Aug 23rd 1913) when certainly the largest gathering of farmers ever seen to congregate at the centre gathered to rejoice in the fact that the district has been provided with a railway. All roads led to Ongerup that Wednesday. Some people proceeded by train, some by road, whilst others again whizzed out by motor. “The Sunday Times” representative was privileged to join a party at Katanning, proceeding out by patroller, Mr. Cecil Piesse having charge of the wheel. We sat beside him, and as we passed verdant fields and rich fallow to be seen on all sides, he told us of the progress made everywhere, and generally of the prosperity which the season augured. At 10.30 or near it, the train from Tambellup put in an appearance, and as our member of the cautious Piesse family reckoned the road from Gnowangerup to Ongerup wouldn't improve his car we (News reporter) decided to get on board the train, and the writer wasn't sorry! Especially as the two bankers who accompanied the party were impatient for a settlement of the overdue train.

There were eight coaches on this train, including the Ministerial car, and each compartment was turned into a sort of early-door crush, some standing, others sitting on friends. (I speak of men). Whilst the chaps underneath twisted uncomfortably on the balance of the journey to Ongerup. In our compartment a card party of farmers and clearers got going the game selected being nap. Sixpence for tree, a “bob” for four and two “bob” for the nap. The game lasted all the way, and was amusing to the onlooker by the fact that the man who mostly dealt and stood up seemed to have the most luck !

Apparently worthless countryside

To gaze out of the carriage windows upon the mostly flat country on the way from Gnowangerup to Ongerup is to be struck with its apparent worthlessness. The land looks very poor in places, whilst here and there are rich chocolate and red loamy patches. In fact, at first glance the country resembles very closely the half-sandplain lands of Tammin and other outback one-time kangaroo haunts. We mentioned this to one of the leading farmers of the district. He agreed with us that the appearance of the country from the train was not so inviting as one would wish, but he pointed out to us what was subsequently very apparent, i.e. that this soil carried wonderfully (for W.A.) heavy feed. We looked for the fodder and there it was, sure enough. On some of the ring-barked areas it was astonishing to see the very heavy feed carried, whilst the sheep browsing upon it looked to be in splendid condition. It was asserted that in this as in other railway extensions the route has not been taken through the best lands, and so the view from the train is not as fair as it might be. However, when we were told that the average yield of wheat was just over 15 bushels (5 bags) we were satisfied that this must be far better land than one would think (presuming the writer is looking at Gnowangerup side of our country here)

Land Clearing Techniques;- then again, this writer has never seen such a mixed and ever-changing country in regard to the vegetation it carries. The sand-plain patches can easily be ploughed up without any previous treatment other than the running of a fire through them, whilst the mallee country can easily be removed of its surface growth. There are slightly heavier kinds of mallee, though, in places, which would, we should think, take more than the ordinary treatment. Salmon gum forests, when cleared, are reported to yield abundantly in this district whilst it is claimed there is practically no waste land. In 1912 –12, 75,000 bags of wheat were taken off the fields between Gnowangerup and Ongerup. Whilst the estimate for 1913 was 130,000 bags. The settlers in these rich wheat lands are going in hot and strong in the near future may be gauged from the fact the 3 deputations from adjoining districts; Gnowangerup, Ongerup & Needilup entered a request to the Minister for Railways for the establishment of a State Flour Mill Evidently these people realize that the future is to bring abundant harvest, for another matter mentioned (not as one of urgency) was the Bulk Handling facilities. There is a good healthy tone about farmers in a wheat country who want flour mills and bulk handling, surely.

Healthy Hedgehog Slice



Ingredients

- 1 cup walnuts
- 1/2 cup dried dates Soaked in hot water and drained
- 2 tbsp honey
- 2 tbsp cocoa
- 3 tbsp desiccated coconut
- 1 cup puffed rice

TOPPING

- 100 grams dark chocolate buttons
- 1 tblsp coconut oil

Method

1. Line a loaf tin with baking paper.serves 16150 calories per serve
2. In a food processor blend walnuts, soaked dates, honey, cocoa and coconut.
3. Transfer mix to bowl and mix through puffed rice. Press mix into tin.
4. Set aside whilst you make the topping.
5. Melt chocolate buttons and coconut oil together in the microwave in 30 second increments.
6. Stir until combined, then pour over base.
7. Move tin from side to side so that the topping evenly covers the base.
8. Tap tin on bench, then put into freezer for ten minutes.
9. Cut slice into 16 bars.
10. Keep in fridge or freezer in an air tight container.

Ingredients

- 1 1/4 cup 185g self raising flour
- 1/2 cup 75g grated tasty cheese
- 200 ml milk
- 1 egg
- 60 g melted butter
- salt and pepper
- 1 small tomato - chopped into small pieces.
- 1 zucchini - grated
- 80 g shaved ham
- extra butter for greasing the pan.

Sift the self raising flour into a large bowl and add the grated cheese before stirring to combine.

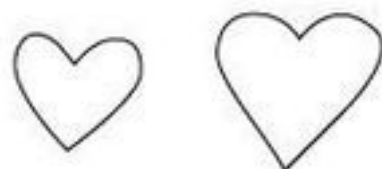
Add the milk, egg, cooled melted butter and a pinch of salt and pepper to a large measuring jug and whisk together until combined.

Add the grated zucchini, sliced ham, chopped tomato and the liquid ingredients to the bowl with the flour and grated cheese and gently stir until just combined.

Heat your frying pan over a medium heat and add a little butter. Use a tablespoon to scoop up the pikelet mixture and place six of them (or however many will fit into your frying pan) into your pre-heated frying pan. Cook the pikelets for 2 minutes before carefully flipping them over and cook for a further one minute on the other side.

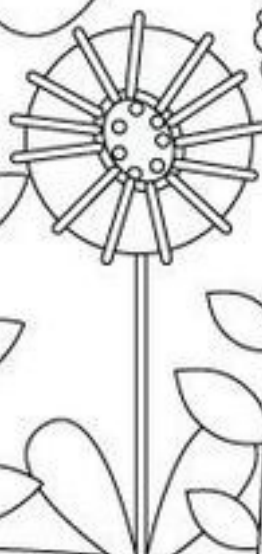
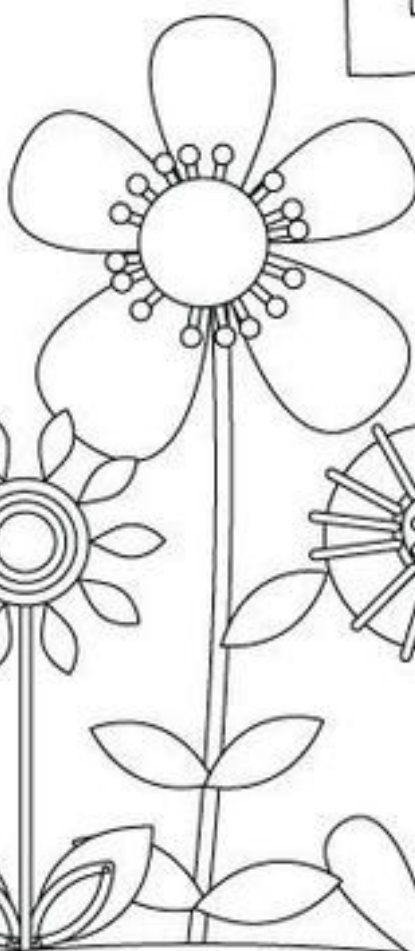
Transfer the cooked pikelets to a plate and cover with foil to keep warm. Repeat until you have used all of the mixture.
