Malleefowl Release 2020

On Wednesday the 22nd July seven young Malleefowl were banded in the early morning by Peter Mawson (Perth Zoo Science Program Leader, DBCA) their condition was assessed and DNA samples were taken to determine the sexes.

Two of the seven Malleefowl were then taken to 'Foster Block', a privately owned remnant bush land block located just outside of Ongerup. The owners of this property advised us that the block had been fox baited and that there were sightings of Malleefowl close by throughout harvest.

Four Malleefowl were taken to 'Wadderin Sanctuary' in Naremben the following day. Wadderin Sanctuary is a 430 hectare reserve surrounded by a 9km long feral predator-proof fence. This

sanctuary is run by a local community group as well as the wildlife research being managed by Jeff Short (Director and Principal Research Scientist for 'Wildlife and Research Management'). The sanctuary has hosted numerous conservation programs, including the reintroduction of locally endangered mammals and birds, research on endangered species status and distribution and management of the remaining suitable habitat of species such as the Red-tailed Phascogale.

Three Malleefowl were released into Wadderin Sanctuary in 2012 and remnants of their mounds can still be seen today, deeming the release a success and we have high expectations that the new arrivals will also be successful.

Malleefowl are classified as vulnerable in Western Australia under the EPBC Act and while there is limited knowledge of the current population trend, it is presumed their numbers are declining. Majority of the Malleefowl's preferred habitat has been modified for grazing or cleared for agriculture. Along with the lack of available habitat the Malleefowl population is highly affected by increased fire regimes, predation from feral predators and fragmentation of their habitat halting genetic transfer.

While the recently released Malleefowl chicks have the ability to fly in and out of the Wadderin Reserve, we hope that by providing them with this habitat it will give hope to the continuity of the species.

These Malleefowl chicks were the offspring of 'Spud' and 'Romeo', two of our resident Malleefowl in the Yongergnow aviaries that successfully built and maintained a mound. The age range of the chicks prior to release were from 6 to 8 months. Prior to their release we ensured that the Malleefowl offspring had the best possible care including supplemented calcium carbonate, insectivore mix as well as a mix of seed and meal worms for protein.

We currently have one chick remaining in Yongergnow's care which was ever so slightly too young and small to be released but we still had a band fitted to its leg and it will head to 'Foster block' as soon as it reaches its ideal size.

We would love to hear some name suggestions for the last chick soon to be released?

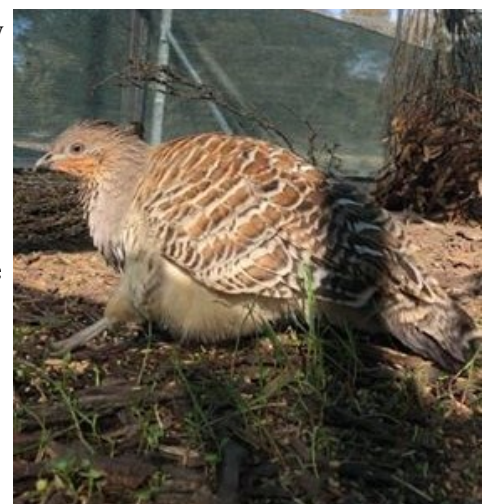

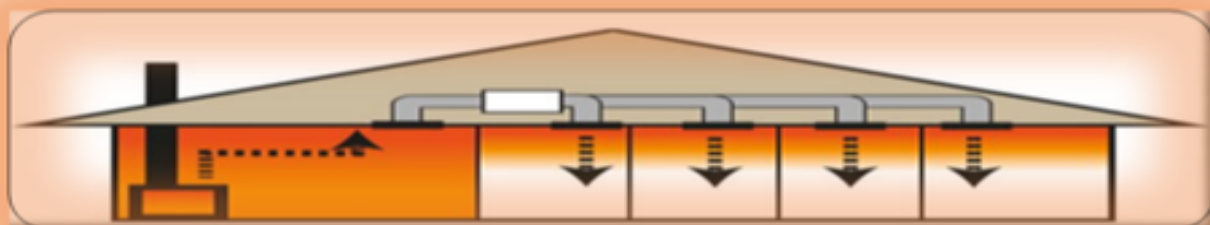

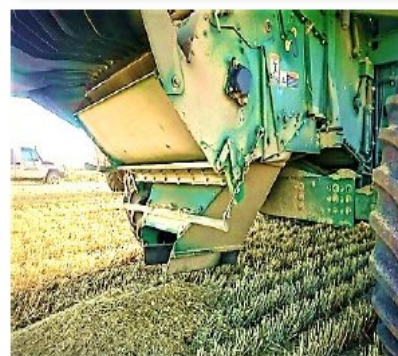
