Can we keep up at this pace?

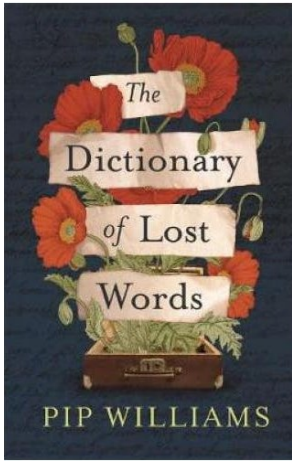
Test the sample, take the grain

BOOKCLUB REVIEW FOR OCTOBER 2020

THE DICTIONARY OF LOST WORDS PIP WILLIAMS.



In 1901, the word 'Bondmaid' was discovered missing from the Oxford English Dictionary. This is the story of the girl who stole it.

Esme is born into a world of words. Motherless and irrepressibly curious, she spends her childhood in the 'Scriptorium', a garden shed in Oxford where her father and a team of dedicated lexicographers are collecting words for the very first Oxford English Dictionary. Esme's place is beneath the sorting table, unseen and unheard. One day a slip of paper containing the word 'bondmaid' flutters to the floor. Esme rescues the slip and stashes it in an old wooden case that belongs to her friend, Lizzie, a young servant in the big house. Esme begins to collect other words from the Scriptorium that are misplaced, discarded or have been neglected by the dictionary men. They help her make sense of the world. Over time, Esme realises that some words are considered more important than others, and that words and

meanings relating to women's experiences often go unrecorded. While she dedicates her life to the Oxford English Dictionary, secretly, she begins to collect words for another dictionary: The Dictionary of Lost Words.

Set when the women's suffrage movement was at its height and the Great War loomed, The Dictionary of Lost Words reveals a lost narrative, hidden between the lines of a history written by men. It's a delightful, lyrical and deeply thought-provoking celebration of words, and the power of language to shape the world.

On Monday night six of us made it to Book club at Mel's. Of the six two of us had completed it. The rest of us had made a start and were some way through. This book is well written and the subject interesting but it just flat lines along. There is no excitement or great things happening. It is a slow read and deals with women's fight to be considered equal in all things. Especially education and the work force.

BIGGEST TRACTOR NO LONGER A REALITY FOR GNOWANGERUP

FINANCIAL prudence has put a stop to Gnowangerup's bid to build Australia's biggest tractor.

Gnowangerup was named as Trachmach's preferred site for a 'Big Tractor' replica in 2019, with hope the project would put the Shire on the map of 'Australia's Biggest Things to visit' and increase tourism and visitor traffic to the area. But the prohibitive cost to build the giant Chamberlain replica has now halted that dream.

The Gnowangerup Biggest Tractor Committee have decided, after receiving three tender amounts using the exacting drawings and specifications as set by their agreement with Trachmach, that the estimated building cost is neither realistic nor desirable in the current economic climate with limited corporate and government grant opportunities.

Gnowangerup Biggest Tractor Committee co-chair Kate O'Keeffe said the committee was also cognisant of the burden a significant fundraising figure would place on the local community.

"Since project inception we have had fantastic support from both the Shire of Gnowangerup and GNP 360 but we were always conscious of not wanting to place a huge financial burden on ratepayers and residents in order to achieve this build, Ms O'Keeffe said."

"Once we received the tender's we acknowledged the amount needed to build the tractor would be totally out of step with community expectations for this project."

The committee discussed reducing the size of the tractor or the scale of the project but even with those measures the cost would not reduce significantly to warrant its continuation.

The Gnowangerup Biggest Tractor Committee have informed Trachmach of their decision.

"We wish Trachmach the best of luck in finding another Western Australian town who is able to see the Big Tractor project come to fruition," Ms O'Keeffe said.

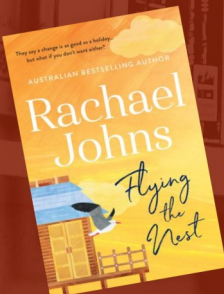

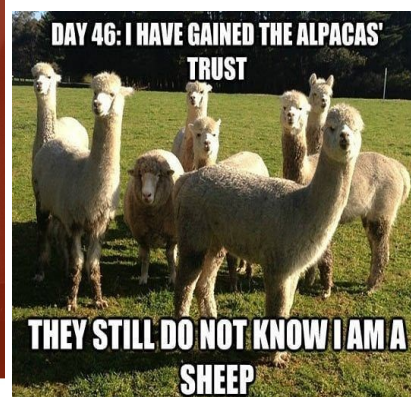

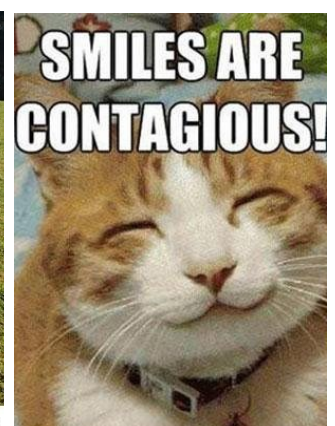
