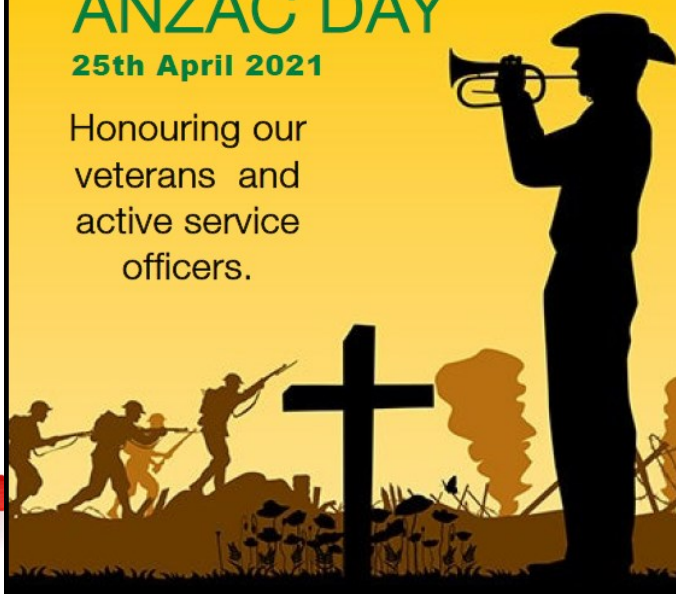

PUBLIC CONSULTATION

RETENTION OF, OR DISPOSITION AND RELOCATION OF, THE SALT RIVER HALL

The Shire of Gnowangerup is seeking community comment on the future of the Salt River Hall which has reached a stage of disrepair such that its future needs to be determined.

The Hall was constructed in 1925 to serve as a school, and later was used for meetings and social functions including dances for the residents of the Salt River area. It is constructed of timber and corrugated iron. It is sited on a Reserve vested in the Shire for Community Purposes.

A recent assessment was done of the condition of the building:

- Stumps are in fair condition for their age.
- Floor is in good condition given its age.
- External cladding has some loose sheets and some missing, with minor repairs required to return it to a fair condition.
- Windows are mostly damaged and require considerable repairs and restoration.
- The front doors are missing and one back door is missing and would need to be reconstructed.
- The roof is in a poor condition with one sheet broken away and numerous sheets with holes or other damage caused by corrosion. The roof would require major repairs to restore the buildings integrity.
- The kitchen is seriously compromised with stump failure, and windows and cladding missing. It is recommended that this section be demolished as it is considered to be dangerous.

The Shire is seeking input from the community as to its value as a historical building, its possible community use, and what its future might be, including demolition or relocation.

Grants might be secured for the restoration of the hall, but it is likely that the Shire would be required to contribute and commit to the ongoing maintenance of the hall. This would need to be accommodated in future budgets.

Submissions are invited from residents and other parties that might have an interest in restoring the hall in situ or relocating it and taking responsibility for its ongoing repairs and maintenance.

Submissions should be in writing and include your name and address, a brief overview of your opinion on its future use, and your opinion on its current location. Depending on the outcome of the consultation process, Council may choose to dispose of the hall, including its relocation, and if it did so, it would publicly seek expressions of interest from parties wishing to acquire the hall.

To assist in preparing a submission, a copy of the Heritage Assessment and Conservation Plan prepared by Hammond and Green Architects in 1994 can be viewed on the Shire's website or a hard copy can be picked up from the Shire Administration building during office hours at 28 Yougenup Road Gnowangerup.

Submissions must be received by the Shire by 4PM on Monday 31st May 2021 and can be posted to:

COMMUNITY FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE GRANTS 2021/22

Community Groups within the Shire of Gnowangerup are now invited to apply for Community Financial Assistance Grants (CFAG) Program. There are three categories of funding available for projects taking place in 2021/22 financial year.

1. **Quick Grants** - for applications up to \$500.00, primarily for volunteer support.
2. **Community Grants** - for applications from \$501.00 - \$5,000.00 aimed at supporting community groups with small capital projects, events, projects etc.
3. **Special Requests Community Grants** - for applications from \$5000.00 - \$20,000.00 aimed at supporting community groups with large capital projects, events, projects etc. The purpose of the grant is not to fund operating costs.

Comprehensive guidelines, application forms and acquittal statements for each category can be found on our website under "Public Notices" or by contacting the Shire Office on 9827 1007.

Requests for operational funding, works-in-kind or reimbursement for expenses prior to the 2021/22 financial year will no longer be accepted under the guidelines. Furthermore, this is now the only pathway to request Council contribution for partnership funding for any project throughout the year. Please consider all events, projects or infrastructure your community group is planning for the 2021/22 year carefully, as applications will only be open once per year.

If your community group is interested in applying for assistance under any of the grant categories, please make contact with our Community Development Coordinator, Kirsty Buchanan on 9827 1007 or email kirsty.buchanan@gnowangerup.wa.gov.au to discuss your idea.

Step 1 - Contact the Shire of Gnowangerup to discuss your project idea on 9827 1007

Step 2 - Complete the respective Grant Application Form.

Step 3 - Submit the application form by 4:00pm 28/5/2021.

Step 4 - Applications are assessed; Council approves suitable applicants at the Annual Budget meeting.

Step 5 - Applicants are notified in writing in August 2021.

We look forward to supporting our fantastic community organisations in 2021/22.

Commemorative 10 Day Tour from Broomehill via the Wheatbelt to the Eastern Goldfields June 2021

Expressions of Interest (EOI) called from people who have a passionate interest in history, heritage, fauna and flora, agri-tourism, indigenous cultures and country who wish to join a **4WDV "Tag-Along - off the beaten track" eco-tour** travelling from Broomehill and then along the Holland Track/Way through the Wheatbelt and up the Victoria Rocks Rd (Holland Way) to the "Old Camp" and the Eastern Goldfields. We travel through the Wheatbelt towns of Katanning, Nyabing, Pingrup, Lake Grace, Newdegate and Hyden (Wave Rock) to Coolgardie, Kalgoorlie-Boulder and Norseman to celebrate and commemorate:

- **John Holland, John Carmody and David and Rudolph Krakour who cut the Holland Track to the "Old Camp" in 1893**
- **The 75th Anniversary of the Eastern Goldfields Historical Society and**
- **Support National Parks for the Wheatbelt and Great Western Woodlands.**

Community campouts will be promoted at Broomehill (night before departure), Holland Tank Rock (between Pingrup and Newdegate), Wave Rock Resort and bush locations near Norseman so encouraging local residents to join us with the commemorations. Tour conditions will apply and some minor costs may be involved. Note the tour will include many of the features of my eco-tour the Holland Track Woodlands, Rocks and Trails Outback Wilderness tour <https://www.greatsouthernoutback.com.au/holland-track-wilderness-tours> and on return will travel via Caves Hill, Burra and Widgiemooltha to Norseman and back by the Granite & Woodlands Discovery Trail to Hyden and Katanning.
