Christopher John Hounsham

was the eldest child of Tom and Mary Hounsham. The Hounsham family lived on the corner of Eldridge and Walker Street in Ongerup, they had a long family association with the town. Unfortunately due to the nature of his birth Chris suffered a mild intellectual disability which delayed his development. He was able to attend Ongerup Primary School, he learnt to read and write, basic math and telling the time. He was so reliable with his time telling that it was his job to ring the bell every day. Chris left school at the age of 16 and went straight to work for CBH, where he worked continuously for 37 years. Chris was the Ongerup Football clubs number 1 supporter and could be seen at every home game running the water, cheering loudly and doing all he could to help his beloved roos win. When he finished with CBH it was decided that Chris and his Mother Mary would be better to move to Albany to be closer to medical facilities. For the first time in his life at age 53 Chris was classified as having a disability and began working for Activ Industries. Chris never lost his love for Ongerup, he always kept up with the Ongerup Roos when the team was still playing and eagerly caught up with any Ongerup people at the Spencer Park Shopping Centre wanting to know how much rain had fallen, how seeding/harvest was going and how the local Football was faring. Chris was laid to rest with his

Mother and father in the Ongerup Cemetery.

He will rest peacefully in his beloved Ongerup with his family.

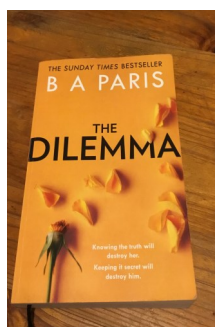

NEW DISABILITY ACCESS AND INCLUSION PLAN 2021-2026

The purpose of a Disability Access and Inclusion Plan (DAIP) is to ensure that people with a disability can access services provided by public authorities in Western Australia and to participate and be included in their community.

The goal is to provide, as much as reasonable, the same level of access as people without disability enjoy, and to ensure that people are not discriminated against on the basis of their disability.

Following a period of public consultation where community members were invited to submit feedback about their experience with accessibility of Council facilities and services, the Shire of Gnowangerup completed a review of the Disability Access and Inclusion Plan, with a view to the next five year period 2021-2026. Thank you to those members of the community who provided feedback and suggestions, these have been noted for consideration in this year's works program.

At its Ordinary Council Meeting held on 23rd June 2021 the Council endorsed the new Disability Access and Inclusion Plan 2021-2026.

National Science Week is Australia's annual celebration of science and technology. This year the Friends of the Fitzgerald River National Park are holding the following activities to encourage an interest in science pursuits. Both members and the general public are welcome to attend, and we encourage younger people to come along and be fascinated by this exceptional national park.

Saturday 21st August at Twertup:

2.30 pm – Twertup botanical walk. Join local botanist, Dr Gillian Craig on a 4 km walk starting at the Twertup Field Studies Centre. Bring walking shoes, hat and water.

7.30 pm – Twertup owl hunt. Vanessa Lipianin, FRNP Senior Operations Officer and owl enthusiast, will guide a search for these night predators near the Field Studies Centre. Bring walking shoes and torch.

Sunday 22nd August at Point Ann:



10 am – Morning tea (byo), meet at Point Ann picnic/bbq area.

11 am – Point Ann whale watching. Cetacean researchers, John Totterdell and Kirsty Alexander, will talk about the humpback, southern right, killer and blue whales as they migrate along the South Coast. Bring binoculars.

1 pm – Discover Hooded Plovers. Join local bird enthusiast, Anne Gadsby, as she searches the known hiding places for these vulnerable shore birds. Meet at Point Ann picnic/bbq area.



Note: Access to Twertup is via a 10 km 4WD track from Quiss Rd/ Pabelup Dr which is closed during wet soil conditions. Point Ann may also be closed in wet weather.
