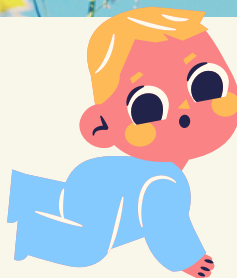

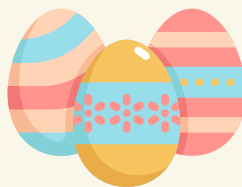

So much life in Warperup Creek

The school holidays kicked off with a stunning day for North Stirlings Pallinup Natural Resources' Warperup Creek Community Event. 50 locals ventured to the creek to learn all about the cultural and ecological importance of the Warperup Creek.

We were fortunate enough to hear from local Goreng elder Ezzard Flowers as he shared his stories about the creek and the Pallinup River. We learnt that these waterways are not only environmentally important but are sacred sites of significance that hold many dreamtime stories. Next time we must try steeping some Jam tree leaves to make a yummy tea!



We then heard from Steve and Geraldine Janicke from Janicke Environmental Investigations. Steve enlightened us with some water quality facts and quizzed both kids and adults with a Salinity guessing game. After measuring the salinity at that site, we found that the Warperup Creek was 90% as salty as the ocean! Regardless of the high salinity, Geraldine impressed us with what was living in the creek. Armed with nets, the kids were surprisingly skilled at catching all sorts of creatures. We found many different fly larvae species, plenty of diving beetles, and some fish, including the Western Minnow! Even the delicious muffins from Yongergnow café were not enough to entice some kids out of the water.

It was a fun morning and I think attendees left with a greater appreciation for our local waterways. Many thanks to Ezzard Flowers, Steve and Geraldine Janicke, Paul O'Meehan for happily letting us use the site on his property, and State NRM. Djeran at Nowanup

Djeran season has started and last week Friends of Nowanup had their Noongar Language and Culture Camp to celebrate and appreciate this season.

For those who are not familiar with the area, Nowanup is 50 km South-West of Ongerup: it's a place of cultural significance and is also part of Gondwana Link ecological restoration program. Noongar Elders, now represented by Uncle Eugene and his family are now the custodians of the program.

For the Djeran camp, Uncle Eugene welcomed Yongergnow-Ongerup CRC staff for a day of discovery and understanding of the Mooditj Boodja, the good land. Auntie Eliza and Auntie Annie, former residents of the Ongerup area, shared their stories and some Noongar recipes as well. In the afternoon, the group went for a walk along a snake shaped bush trail, under the guidance of Uncle Eugene. In a short 1.5 km we came across a variety of natural wonders: the stunning breakaways, rocks, wildlife footprints, native bush tucker and regenerative salt bush. Along the way, some miamia have been erected, to offer both cover and a place for learning.

The experience was a journey between ecology and mystical anthropology, which is stated clearly in Friends of Nowanup's mission: "Healing the land and healing the people".
