

NOTICE – INSTALLATION OF TWO WATER FLOW METERING SYSTEMS

The Shire of Gnowangerup, with the assistance of the Department of Water and Environmental Regulation is installing two Water Flow Metering systems.

One will be located at the Standpipe Dam within the Gnowangerup Town Site and the other will be located at the Formby Bore Tank Site.

These units will be operational as of Monday 19 December 2022

Users will be required to obtain a FOB from the Shire Administration Office with a \$20 refundable bond required.

These systems will allow site usage which is now required to be reported on an annual basis.

Private pumps should not be connected to the dam or tank unless it is a Fire Emergency.

Provision Of Replacement Footbridge (Park Street, Gnowangerup, WA, 6335)

- Scope of Works.**
 - Remove current footbridge structure located at Park Street, Gnowangerup, WA, 6335.
 - Construct and install replacement structure as per provided plans.
- Site Location**
Park Street, Gnowangerup, WA, 63355
- Old Structure**
Existing wooden stringers with wooden plank deck and steel rails are to be removed and disposed of at the Gnowangerup Waste Facility.
- New Structure**
 - Steel framed concrete deck with steel posts and wooden rails mounted on concrete footings.
 - Finished deck height to match existing footpath levels.
 - Structure to conform to supplied plan and specifications.
 - Structure to be tied into existing footpath levels using concrete that meets disability standards.
- Work Health & Safety**
 - All personnel and contractors must have all required licences and qualifications as required under both State and Federal Laws.
 - Crane Use - The Shire's Manager of Works is to approve all crane access and positioning.

STOCK CROSSINGS ON ROADS

With Harvest in full swing, many livestock owners might be looking at moving their stock into other paddocks which may result in stock being moved across roads.

It is important that livestock owners are meeting their legislative responsibilities when undertaking this task, for not only motorists safety, but also the safety of themselves and the stock.

The Road Traffic Code 2000 regulates the driving of stock across roads, and under Regulation 276 it states;

A person shall not drive stock along or across a road unless the person —

(a) takes all reasonable precautions to warn approaching traffic of the presence of the stock; and

(b) arranges the driving of the stock at such times, and in such numbers, and establishes such control of the stock on the road, as is likely to prevent it causing unreasonable delay to the passage of other traffic.

Main Roads WA have developed guidelines for livestock owners to ensure that they meet legislative requirements when undertaking stock road crossings. This guideline can be found here:

The guideline also includes information such as the appropriate signage required as well as minimum spacing distances depending on the posted speed zone for that road.

Fines can be imposed to stock owners that do not comply with legislative requirements, and also may be liable for any injuries or damages caused in the event of an accident occurring.

Reduction of Councillors (Elected Members) - Voluntary Pathway for Local Government Reform

As part of an overhaul of the *Local Government Act 1995* being undertaken by the Minister for Local Government, there is a requirement for all Councils to review both ward boundaries and the number of Elected Member to best represent their community.

At its meeting held Wednesday 26 October 2022, Council resolved, in part:

'1022.123 That Council:

(1) Advises the Department of local Government Sport, and Cultural Industries (the Department) that it chooses the Voluntary Pathway for Local Government Reform, outlined by the Minister for Local Government in his letter to the Shire dated 20 September 2022, by advising that it will reduce the number of Councillors for the Shire of Gnowangerup from nine to seven over two elections:

- with a reduction to eight for the 2023 election*
- with a reduction to seven for the 2025 election'*

By electing the Voluntary Pathway, Council is now required to seek submissions from residents/ratepayers on the matter.

After careful consideration, Council has made the decision to reduce the number of Elected Members from nine to seven over two election cycles. This decision was made as a reduction in numbers was inevitable and it was felt that by being proactive, it will reduce, if not eliminate, the risk that the Shire of Gnowangerup be directed by the Minister for Local Government to declare all Elected Member positions vacant and reduce the number of Elected Members to five.

Council considers seven Elected Members will still allow for the community to be well represented. With no ward boundaries, Councillors can be elected from anywhere within the Shire.

You are encouraged to submit a response via email to gnpshire@gnowangerup.wa.gov.au or mail to 28 Yougenup Road, Gnowangerup, WA, 6335 providing feedback on Council's Resolution. This consultation period will close on Thursday 5 January 2023 at 4.00pm and a report presented to Council on Wednesday 1 February 2023 based on submissions received with the outcome then being provided to the Department of Local Government, Sport and Cultural Industries.

LOCAL GROUP SUPPORTS MOSQUITO SURVEILLANCE ACTIVITIES IN THE SHIRE OF GNOWANGERUP

The Shire of Gnowangerup has engaged the services of the North Stirlings Pallinup Natural Resources Group (NSPRG) to conduct regular surveillance of known mosquito breeding sites in the Shire. Natural Resources Management Officer Caroline House will undertake regular patrols of known breeding sites along creeks and wetlands throughout this summer near the townsites of Ongerup, Borden and Gnowangerup.

As breeding has now commenced in our creeks and dams surrounding the townsites, there have been reports of biting mossies. As each townsite is surrounded by creeks and low-lying ground containing water, and the warmer weather has started, we expect that there will be more mosquito breeding until the larvicide baits start to take effect. These baits will break the lifestyle of emerging adults and reduce the nuisance to residents. It is also best to look around your home and garden, and start to remove places that mossies can breed, such as under pot plants, in tyres and other places where water is pooling, like blocked guttering, creeks and wetlands.

As there are no vaccines for diseases transmitted by biting mosquitoes, such as Ross River Virus (RRV) and Barmah Forest Virus (BFV), the only form of disease prevention is to avoid being bitten. Fortunately, DOH records indicate that there have been very few infections (7 local infections) from RRV in the last 10 years, but none since 2013 in the Shire of Gnowangerup. However, for the infected persons, these illnesses can be very painful over a lengthy period of time.

If residents have concerns about potential breeding, they should contact Council's Environmental Health Officer on gnpshire@gnowangerup.wa.gov.au to report their concerns or seek further information.
