Forklift Skill Set

This course will provide you with the knowledge and skills required to operate a forklift truck safely. Participants will learn how to operate a forklift truck by planning the work, conducting routine checks on forklift truck, shifting loads in a safe manner and safely shut down and secure equipment after completing operations.

Industry licensing information: this course may allow students with the correct qualifications to apply for the National High Risk Licence class LF. Students must apply and pay for this licence separately with WorkSafe.

Entrance requirements

This course has basic equipment and/or PPE requirements (located under Important information)

Participants must be a minimum of 18 years of age on the date of assessment.

All students must bring to class 2 forms of ID:

- One form must have photo ID (ie Driver's licence, Passport, Over 18 card)
- The other form can be a Medicare Card, any Utility Bill, etc. (that has your full name)

You must have sound literacy and numeracy skills

Christmas beetles

‘Tis the season

As they’re often abundant in mid-summer, these beautiful beetles have been dubbed ‘Christmas beetles’, and now is the season to see them.

Christmas beetles are a type of scarab, belonging to the family Scarabaeidae, which also includes dung beetles and cockchafers. Like other scarabs, Christmas beetles (genus *Anoplognathus*) are large and chunky and are somewhat noisy and clumsy fliers. Most species of these beetles are 2-3 centimetres in length. They are slightly flattened in shape and come in a variety of colours including metallic browns, greens, yellow/gold and pinks. There are 36 species in the genus with all but one unique (endemic) to Australia.

Naughty but native (and nice)

The beetle’s larvae are white curl grubs and feed on the roots of grasses and decaying organic matter. The adults generally feed on *Eucalyptus* leaves. They prefer open woodland to forest and thrive in pastures wherever trees have been retained.

Some species are economically important pests of eucalypt plantations, while others are implicated in the decline of mature trees in some NSW

landscapes. However, over the last century, anecdotal evidence of a decline in Christmas beetles has been compelling, with the Australian Museum attributing the decline to habitat loss.

In WA, Christmas beetles aren’t often reported as pests, except in farmland, where eucalypt trees are scarce. This makes tube stock, saplings, and young trees more vulnerable to the appetites of Christmas beetles, which can form dense masses over the foliage. This is near impossible to prevent, and treat, but the larger the size and number of trees the better the trees’ survival. It’s also hard to blame them for eating too much at Christmas!

If you have a native garden with *Eucalyptus* species or next time you walk through some native bushland, keep an eye out for these living ornaments, decorating (and nibbling) the trees.
