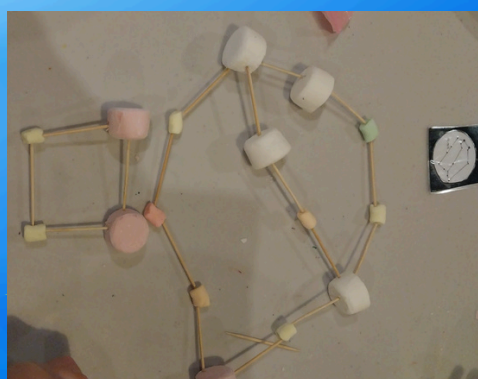

# A letter from Yongergnow's resident malleefowl

## Valentine & Juliet:

Well well well, our fellow Ongerupians, you have all been busy wrapping up the last of the seeding, & now starting some spraying & spreading since it has finally rained (well kind of) while also advocating for the #keepthesheep campaign. With our birds eye view (pun intended) look on this topic, we Malleefowl support this #keepthesheep campaign for two reasons; the first being that the sheep industry supports our rural towns survival which is invaluable for the ongoing success of our centre & the second being that the sheep enterprises encourages predator baiting & control which is vital for our wild Malleefowl kin. So from us, as representatives of the native fauna to you, please support & get behind this campaign.

This week has been another busy one: the Shire of Gnowangerup's fire mitigation efforts around town have kicked off, & due to Yongergnow's precious feathered friends (us!) this called for a yet another busy bee. On Tuesday Kingsley, Harry, Ernie, Dan Biddulph, Sarah Bungey & Emily took to the bushland to the west of the carpark with chainsaws to remove the dead wood to be carted away & burnt at a later stage. This work reduced the fire load by 5t/ha effectively reducing the potential flame length & bushfire temperature by up to 20% whilst also making access for emergency services easier throughout the bushland, making our town more resilient to natural disasters.

Thank you to our kind volunteers who tackled the cold morning to ensure that the material was moved in an efficient matter (much like we do!) whilst maintaining the bushland to be a strong ecosystem for flora & fauna, whilst being visually appealing for visitors. All this industrious work accomplished in a calm, quiet manner as not to disrupt the peace & quiet we Malleefowl so do enjoy. If only our volunteers hadn't of stopped for a coffee break, they would have been finished before getting caught in a shower of rain!



A BIG shout out to Roz & Mel Hawkins who have been hard at work giving the garden a rejuvenating facelift, Sandy for her ongoing support each week, & to the staff. We enjoy watching all of you hard at work whilst we sit back & watch.

Fun fact, do you know who our most beloved visitor is? It's none other than Mr. Don Sclater! For over a decade, he's faithfully fed us birds every weekend, kept our water bowls clean, & filled us in on all the town goss. Shout out to you Don, we love you!

### **Successful Project Draws to a Close**

North Stirlings Pallinup Natural Resources Inc (NSPNR) is wrapping up the Expanded predator control program in the Fitz-Stirling Corridor project. This project aimed to protect and enhance populations of three important species – Chuditch, Malleefowl and Carnaby's Black Cockatoo – across the Fitz-Stirling macro corridor and surrounding farmland. This project is supported by funding from the Western Australian Government's State NRM Program.

The objective was for the project partners, including NSPNR, Fitzgerald Biosphere Group, Wellstead Progress Association and Bush Heritage Australia, to collaborate to deliver a coordinated baiting and shooting program across the high priority macro corridor connecting the Stirling Range and Fitzgerald River national parks. The partners wanted to reduce the threat of predation from foxes and feral cats, and reduce competition and habitat destruction by rabbits, resulting in the improved conservation outlook for the target species.

Between January 2023 and May 2024 inclusive, the project undertook several activities:

- six community-led feral animal tally and community breakfast events targeting foxes, feral cats, and rabbits across the project area and surrounding farmland across Shire of Gnowangerup, Shire of Jerramungup, and the Wellstead region
- two volunteer feral animal shooting events targeting foxes, feral cats, and rabbits
- two Registered Pesticide (RP) training workshops in Borden and Jerramungup to support land managers to get RP permits to handle 1080 baits
- two nearby landholders undertook ground baiting targeting foxes with 1080 baits.

The project has resulted in 1004 foxes, 42 cats and 757 rabbits being removed from the landscape across and around the Fitz-Stirling Corridor, 10 landholders have started the process to get RP permits, and 80 dried meat fox baits containing 1080 poison were put out on two nearby farms. 327 participants and community members have been involved with the project's activities.

The Fitz-Stirlings was identified as a Priority Place in the Australian Government's 2022-2032 Threatened Species Action Plan. The Fitz-Stirling macro corridor lies within the Southwest Australia Global Biodiversity Hotspot. The 80-km macro corridor is home to a high number of endemic species and provides critical connected habitat for numerous threatened species. Biodiversity within the corridor has been severely impacted by over-clearing and predation by introduced feral cats and red foxes, with the latter identified as a key threat under the EPBC Act for medium-sized native mammals and ground nesting birds.

While NSPNR's predator control project will soon draw to a close, it has fostered connections and knowledge that will allow NSPNR to continue to support landholders in the sub-region to control foxes, feral cats and rabbits.
