Tom Hart

from an interview conducted by the Ongerup primary School

Tom started in 1960 and came here for 7 years until Grade 7. Grades 1-3 were in one room and he had about 30 kids in his class. Year 4-7 were in the other room. Tom lived about 10 miles North West or 15 kilometres northwest of Ongerup. He caught a school bus to school every day.

They were about halfway around on the bus run so they never had a really early bus or really late bus, but it was around 8:00 or just after 8o'clock. Some kids on the end of the route had a really early bus in the morning and the late bus at night. They had a pretty middle of the road school bus.

The school bus driver was Mr Simmons, and they had him for seven years. There were 2 buses. Mr Campbells bus did the north and east section and then Mr Simmons. When Tom started there was 2 classrooms. When he was in grade 2 they put the third classroom on the end, so they had three classrooms. Before that there used to be tennis courts sort of straight through the bush south of the school and there was an old school building that they used to use as a spillover classroom. These were behind Neil Morgan's house just past the old kindy.

It was used as a tennis pavilion until the tennis courts moved. When Tom was in the current Boomers room the principal's desk used to be on the side and the blackboard was at the back. There were two classrooms with the office in the middle and then they put the third on behind the Boomers room. Tom got sent a few times to the principal's office and he got the cane only when he was really naughty. The principal gave the cane. The veranda was open all way along and they weren't allowed to run on it, they would get told off. We have the same rules now. They used to play hopscotch. It was dirt where the undercover area is and they used to play marbles. Everybody brought their marbles to school and the good players ended up with a lot of marbles and the bad players ended up with very few.

They had a head prefect of each class. The kids could play in the bush but weren't allowed to go far but they would play in the paperbark trees. They wrote on paper and in grades 1-3 they had ink on the desk, and they used to use a pen to dip in the ink. Tom had to learn to write with ink. He had good friends at school and used to have a lot of fun.

They had nice teachers. Don Fraser was the principal for Tom's last few years and he was a wonderful man. Everybody loved him.

The girl's toilets were in the west corner and the boys was in the east corner. The sports shed used to be part of the West Ongerup school and was moved here when that school closed.

Tom had a tin lunchbox, and took vegemite sandwiches and maybe an apple. All the kids had a leather school bag with straps, and they put it on our back to ride our bikes to the bus stop. When he was ten Tom started driving a Model A Ford on the farm and used to drive it to the bus stop.

LOCAL PLANNING POLICIES

At the 21 March 2025 Meeting, Council resolved to advertise two draft local planning policies associated with the Shire's Local Planning Scheme No.2.

The draft policies, and their purpose and intent, are listed below. Complete documents of each policy are available on the Shire's website at www.gnowangerup.wa.gov.au under 'Public Notice' or as a hard copy at the Shire office – 28 Yougenup Road, Gnowangerup WA 6335.

OVERVIEW OF POLICIES

Draft Local Planning Policy – Gnowangerup Airport

The current Gnowangerup Airport Local Planning Policy defines where aeroplane hangars should be developed. The policy also defines standards for development and standards for the leasing of land at the airport.

The Shire has drafted an updated Gnowangerup Airport Local Planning Policy, which includes the following additional matters, for use in assessing new land-use and development proposals at the Gnowangerup Airport:

- Consultation with the Aboriginal community
- Suitable provision of power supply and vehicle access
- Management of stormwater
- Appropriate storage of fuels and chemicals
- Lease arrangements
- Appropriate location of hanger developments

Draft Local Planning Policy – Renewable Energy Facilities

The draft Shire of Gnowangerup Renewable Energy Facilities policy has been developed to ensure that developers engage with the community and take on-board any concerns, before applying for development approval for a Renewable Energy Facility (wind or solar farm).

The policy provides essential information to assist the Council in making an informed decision regarding a proposal to develop a renewable energy facility. The policy outlines key expectations for developers regarding the necessary requirements to be included in a development application. Additionally, the policy aims to foster community confidence by ensuring a transparent and thorough decision-making process.






