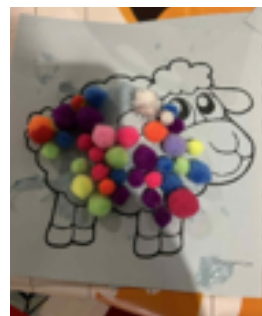

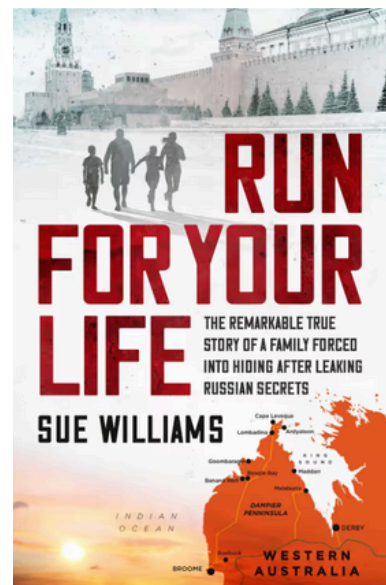

DID YOU KNOW 1 FARMER COMMITS SUICIDE EVERY 10 DAYS?

Suicide was the main cause of death for Australians aged 15 to 49 years in 2019. Mental health has a huge impact on every aspect of people's lives. It affects behaviour, physical health, work and relationships, as well as the people around them.

The National Farmer Wellbeing Report is shining a spotlight on a national health crisis needing urgent attention. It has found in recent years nearly half of Australian farmers (45%) have felt depressed, with almost two thirds (64%) experiencing anxiety. For one in seven (14%), it's a frequent experience. This data adds to existing bodies of research which found that one farmer commits suicide every 10 days and Australian farmers are twice as likely to commit suicide when compared to the general population.

More than a quarter of farmers (27%) say feelings of loneliness or isolation, combined with limited access to mental health services have had the biggest impact on their mental health over the past five years. Southern Agcare provides support, counselling and advocacy for people struggling with Mental health, poverty, domestic violence, homelessness, grief and other forms of crisis or trauma. We cover an area of some 40,500 square kilometres, servicing the Shires of West Arthur, Darkan, Wagin, Dumbleyung, Lake Grace, Woodanilling, Katanning, Kent, Kojonup, Broomehill-Tambellup, Gnowangerup, Jerramungup, Cranbrook, Plantagenet, and Denmark.

RECYCLING NEWS



This is planned to be a regular segment to improve our recycling practices and find out how and where we can get rid of stuff! With the limited tip hours at the moment, it would be great to be able to sort anything and/or everything into another place to go to its eventual resting place without filling up landfill.

YELLOW RECYCLING BINS:

Most households in town have a yellow bin that is collected fortnightly, and there is a bank of yellow bins in Carpenter Street behind Ongerup Tyres for use by out-of-towners. These bins take glass, cardboard, paper, newspaper, tin cans, aluminium cans and some plastic containers. Regardless of whether things are recyclable some things are not welcome with the Shire recycling truck run. Common ones are soft plastics and foil lined containers and these can go into the 'normal' rubbish and into the green wheelie bins that are collected every Thursday morning by Shire rubbish truck.

10C CONTAINERS FOR CHANGE:

Shuttles (IBC's) are located at the front of the school and beside the Carpenter Street yellow recycling bins for P&C fundraising with your collected 10c containers, or DYO to collection centres in Albany or Katanning.

DRUM MUSTERS AND BULK WASTE VERGE COLLECTIONS

are generally an annual event, yet to be organised for Ongerup.

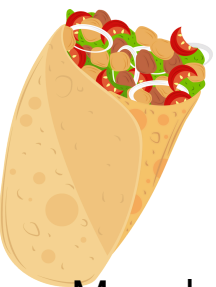
BATTERIES:

Household smaller batteries have a collection point at Yongergnow and get regularly delivered to Bunnings in their recycling point. Large vehicle batteries can be left at the back of the tyre service on a wooden pallet for P&C fundraising.

Please all let's do our best to reduce our rubbish going to the tip and take advantage of the recycling options available.

CHEMICAL SHUTTLES (IBC's)

are only able to be returned to your supplier after triple rinsing and not put into the general landfill at the tip.

Water supply in a bushfire

This information could save your life



While leaving high-risk bushfires is the safest option, if you plan to stay and defend your home, you must have an **INDEPENDENT** water supply and pumping capability. This typically requires water tanks of at least 20,000 litres, pump and generator.

This is required as mains water supply and pressure cannot be guaranteed during a bushfire due to the risk of power cuts, fire damage and extreme demand.

Use the Department of Fire and Emergency Services resources to develop your personal bushfire plan: mybushfireplan.wa.gov.au
You can also download the My Bushfire Plan app via the App Store or Google Play to access your bushfire plan anytime - even without an internet connection.

To support bushfire plans, if you have groundwater bore access to surface water, you can take and store emergency water without it counting against your annual entitlement. For more information on this, and for the location of emergency bushfire water supplies in dryland agricultural areas, visit the Department of Water and Environmental Regulation website.

Drinking water

We recommend you keep a supply of drinking water on hand throughout summer in case your water supply is interrupted.

Assistance for customers affected by bushfire

After a bushfire, we can assist you with issues such as damaged water meters and payment difficulties. If you have been affected by bushfire please call us on **13 13 85**.

New exposure standard for aluminium welding fumes

The workplace exposure standard (WES) for aluminium welding fumes in Western Australia has been lowered from 5 mg/m³ to 1 mg/m³, effective immediately.

Persons conducting a business or undertaking (PCBUs) must take all reasonably practicable steps to reduce exposure risks including reviewing current controls, conducting exposure assessments and implementing higher-level controls, such as substitution, isolation, and engineering controls.

This Statement of Regulatory Intent sets out WorkSafe's approach for enforcing the new aluminium welding fumes exposure standard under the Work Health and Safety (General) Regulations 2022 and Work Health and Safety (Mines) Regulations 2022.

WorkSafe will take an educational approach to this issue over the first 12 months.
